RE: H91: Proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to agricultural and horticultural lands

Dear Speaker Mariano:

The MA Food System Collaborative supports changing our State's constitution in order to provide protection to smaller parcels of land for farming.

It has been nearly 50 years since Article XCIX was enacted, giving the legislature the authority to reduce the tax burden on agricultural land, an action that has contributed greatly to the viability and sustainability of the Commonwealth's farms. While that Article's limitation of such benefits to parcels of land five acres and larger may have been appropriate at the time, it is no longer so because the nature of farming has changed significantly.

Advances in technology and plant genetics, the dramatic loss of farmland and subdividing of many large parcels, the growth of urban agriculture, and increased consumer interest in and support for local foods has resulted in many farmers stewarding multiple small parcels, or even being able to support a viable farm business on very small parcels of land. At the same time, the increasing cost of farmland has resulted in the exclusion of many – particularly farmers of color and young farmers – from being able to afford even small parcels, particularly without the benefit of such tax relief.

And changes in farming will continue to occur. Given forces such as climate change, the state's goals for net zero greenhouse gas emissions, and the growing need for affordable housing, changes in farming practices will likely occur quickly and unpredictably. We support the amendment as proposed by H91.
