Dear Governor Healey, Climate Chief Hoffer,

Subject: Urgent Need for Action on the Massachusetts Healthy Soils Program

As representatives of the undersigned advocacy and conservation organizations, we have long supported the creation of a Massachusetts Healthy Soils Program and many of us participated in the drafting of the Commonwealth's *Healthy Soils Action Plan*. We, the undersigned, are now asking for the Administration's assistance in equipping the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA) to successfully implement this program.

In 2019, Massachusetts became a national leader in advancing soil health by commissioning the first statewide Healthy Soils Action Plan (HSAP), a roadmap for protecting and improving the health of our Commonwealth's soils, which contain our largest carbon stocks. These efforts will safeguard our water quality, food security, farm viability, flood resilience, ecosystem stability and bring us closer to achieving our climate goals. In 2021, the legislature created the Massachusetts Healthy Soils Program to carry this bold and essential vision forward.

The absence of adequate staffing for the Healthy Soils Program, however, has impeded the ability of the EEA to ensure timely and effective management of the program and implementation of the recommendations of the HSAP. To help address these challenges, our coalition respectfully asks that the Commonwealth take the following steps to help ensure the EEA is successful:

- 1. Fill the Soil Health Coordinator Position: This dedicated staff member would help manage the Healthy Soils Program, promote communication, and ensure effective collaboration among stakeholders. Although the MA State Commission on Conservation of Soil, Water & Related Resources previously allocated \$150,000 in the FY25 and FY26 budget for a Soil Health Coordinator, no plans have been made to fill this critical role.
- Include Healthy Soils Funding in the Governor's FY2026 Budget: We request a line item of at least \$2 million for the Healthy Soils Program Fund, providing much-needed continuity and support.

Funding distribution challenges go back to the program's first fiscal year. While \$100,000 allocated for FY22 was used to purchase no-till equipment for conservation districts, recent larger appropriations are still largely undistributed. Although \$1,020,000 was secured for the program in FY24, only \$300,000 was deployed, and the remaining funds were carried into the FY25 budget without a clear plan for distribution. This challenge prevents key stakeholders and

organizations from successfully implementing their projects and undermines the program's intended impact. As a result, essential soil health programs remain under-resourced, despite the availability of funds and the many individuals and organizations who are willing and ready to implement the goals outlined in the Healthy Soils Action Plan.

Massachusetts has shown inspiring leadership in addressing soil health and environmental sustainability, and we believe the Commonwealth can continue to be a model for the nation. We are asking for the Administration's assistance to help EEA be successful. By fully supporting the Healthy Soils Program, we can realize its benefits for the soil, our communities, the state's resilience in the face of climate change and ability to meet its climate goals.
